The District has been deficit spending for a number of years, but intends to turn that situation around in 2021-22 by keeping expenditures within expected revenues. The District has budgeted an improvement to its fund balance of \$358,305, bringing the fund balance to an 8.55% reserve as a percentage of expenditures. Although the District will not achieve a 10% reserve for 2021-22, it will be working towards a 10% (or better) reserve in 2022-23, and it is anticipated that the year-over-year increase in local property taxes will help facilitate that.
